

BEFORE ARRIVAL



Every applicant has to be a university student with which the UEM has an Erasmus+ bilateral agreement signed for a given field of study.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- home university sends your nomination and you receive a welcome message;
- fill in an application form in WSEiZ <u>Erasmus</u>
 <u>Enrolment System</u>
- print a form from the system, get the signatures, and upload it into the system;
- wait for the Letter of Acceptance;
- choose courses and prepare Online Learning Agreement;
- send a European Health Insurance Card (if applicable) and insurance policy;
- book your accommodation and tickets;
- pack your suitcase and come to Warsaw!

COURSES CATALOGUE

All courses, including their descriptions, available for Erasmus+ students in a given academic year are published on the University's <u>website</u>.

INSURANCE

Before arrival, all incoming students have to send the scans of their insurance. Obligatory insurance coverage: health insurance, insurance against accidents and liability insurance. The insurance must cover also the costs of a body's transportation to a home country in case of death. **EU citizens should have a European Health Insurance Card in order to be able to use medical services in Poland**.

VISA

Students from non-EU countries will need a visa to enter Poland. You will find all necessary information concerning visa application on the Polish embassy's website in your home country.

Student apply independently for a visa! If you need a Letter of Acceptance to apply for it, contact the Erasmus Team.

Please mind that it may take a long time to get a visa and application procedure might also differ depending on the embassy. We recommend that you apply for a visa approx. two months in advance.

ACCOMMODATION

Every incoming student can book a place at one of the University dormitories. If you are interested in booking a place in a student dorm, you have to select an option in the application form, contact the Erasmus Team and pay a deposit.

The standard of room varies, the number of places is limited. Thus, the allocation is based on a "first come, first served" basis.

WIŚNIOWA DORMITORY - double rooms available FOR WOMEN

It is located in the district Old Mokotów, 5 minutes' walk from the University.

Rooms are equipped with beds, wardrobes, desks and lamps. There is a fully equipped kitchen with an electric cooker, an oven, a dishwasher, a refrigerator, an electric kettle, a kitchen hood, pots, pans, dishes, cutlery, and a washing machine.

There are a bathroom with a shower cabin, a toilet and a hall with a big double wardrobe.

There are: an iron, an ironing board, a hairdryer, a clothes dryer.

Unlimited free Wi-Fi connection.



Monthly rent: 1220 PLN (265 €) including bills





DABROWSKIEGO DORMITORY - single and double rooms available FOR MEN

It is located in the district Old Mokotów, 10 minutes' walk from the University or 2 tram stops. Rooms are equipped with beds, wardrobes, desks and lamps. There is a fully equipped kitchen with an electric cooker, an oven, a dishwasher, a refrigerator, an electric kettle, a kitchen hood, pots, pans, dishes, and cutlery.

There are 2 bathrooms (one with a bath and a washing machine and one with a shower cabin) and a hall with a big double wardrobe and a sofa.

There are: an iron, an ironing board, a hairdryer, a clothes dryer.

Unlimited free Wi-Fi connection.



Monthly rent: ranges from 1060 PLN (230 €) to 1350 PLN (293 €) - including bills







The deposit of 1350 PLN (293 €) refers to the reservation of a place in the dormitory. It will be refunded at the end of the mobility in case there is no damage or violation of the agreement/dormitory regulations.

Once, the transfer of deposit is done, the payment confirmation should be sent to the Erasmus Team. Then, you will receive an email with a booking confirmation.

At the beginning of your arrival an agreement for renting a place in the Student House of UEM will be signed. While signing it in the Erasmus Office, you have to provide the payment confirmation (payment for the first month, not a deposit payment!).

Monthly fee rent shall be paid in advance by the end of each previous month for the following month. **Cash** payments are not an option!

Tenants must follow dormitory regulations.

Tenants are obliged to have own sheet and linen for a pillow and a duvet!

BUDDY

Every Erasmus+ student will get a Buddy, who is a student of the UEM. The person helps with daily issues related to the mobility.

The Buddy will:

- contact you before arrival;
- pick you from the airport (if needed);
- assist with accommodation (if needed);
- assist with paper work at the university (if needed);
- show you around the university and city;
- answer your questions;
- become your local friend;)



TRANSPORT



There are several options to come to Warsaw. Choose the most suitable for you.

PLANE:

If you decide to travel by plane, you should choose one of the following airports:

- Warsaw Okęcie
- Warsaw Modlin

In order to get to Warsaw from one of these airports, you will have to take a bus, train or taxi.

TRAIN:

There are three main railway stations in Warsaw:

- Warsaw Central Station;
- Warsaw East Station;
- Warsaw West Station.

Other railway stations in Poland:

- Cracow (Kraków Główny);
- Wroclaw (Wrocław Główny);
- Gdansk (Gdańsk Główny) and others.



CHECKLIST



You received a WELCOME MESSAGE

You sent an APPLICATION FORM (signed by you and your university)

You received a LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE

You booked ACCOMMODATION

You paid a DEPOSIT and received a booking confirmation (in case you want to live in a dormitory)

You applied for a VISA (if needed)

You made contact with your BUDDY

You downloaded and use the ERASMUS+ APP

You wrote details of your arrival to the Erasmus Team and your Buddy

You received information about the WELCOME MEETING





If you know when you are going to come to Warsaw, write details of your arrival to the Erasmus Team and your Buddy.

After your arrival to Warsaw:

- come to the Erasmus Office (12 Olszewska Str. room no 13) to confirm your arrival;
- sign an agreement for renting a place in the Student House of UEM (while signing it in the Erasmus Office, you must provide the payment confirmation (payment for the first month, not a deposit payment!);
- pay for the first month of your stay (in case you booked a place in the university dormitory);
- get Student ID;
- take part in the Welcome Meeting;
- start your Erasmus experience!



STUDENT ID

In order to receive a student ID you should bring 1 passport-style photograph, in colour, undamaged, with good focus, size 45x35 mm to the Erasmus Office.

This Student ID will allow you to use UEM's Library and Reading room. In addition, it provides you with discounts in public transport, restaurants, bars, cinemas, theatres, as well as sport and leasure facilities.

You will have to pay **22 PLN** for the Student ID card. The payment should be made by bank transfer to the University's bank account:





PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public transport in Warsaw is well organized. There are buses, trams, and the underground.

Further information on tickets and timetables are available <u>here</u>.

While you are in Warsaw we encourage you to use a helpful app called **Jak dojadę**. It will help you move easily around the city.

You can also use <u>Warsaw Public Bike</u> - the alternative means of transport, allowing quick navigation through Warsaw. The stations are almost everywhere and it is possible to move around quickly, cheaply or even for free!





BEFORE DEPARTURE

Before coming back home you should:

- pass all your exams (the Transcript of Records will be sent to you and your Coordinator within 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished);
- inform the UEM Erasmus Team about the date of your departure;
- take the LETTER OF CONFIRMATION from the Erasmus Office;

In case you stayed in the dormitory:

- fill in a DEPOSIT DECLARATION;
- pack all your things, clean your room and leave the dormitory premises in the condition as it was at the moment of checking in;
- leave the keys in the Erasmus Office;
- take Erasmus memories with you :)



SAVE THE PLANET

- try to reduce the abuse of paper and follow the digital documentation by using Erasmus Enrolment System, create Online Learning Agreement and use Erasmus+ App;
- recycle rubbish within the UEM facilities, dormitories, EVERYWHERE!
- use reusable water bottles and eliminate plastic containers - in the UEM's buildings there are water sources of Warsaw tap water;
- come to the classes by bike, there are bicycle racks on the UEM campuses;
- use public transport, Warsaw Public Bike or go for a walk;)
